Welcome to The North Wall. Our ushers will be here to meet you when you arrive. You will recognise them by the lanyards they are wearing round their necks.

There is hand sanitiser by the door for you to clean your hands.


One of our ushers will check your temperature. They will point the thermometer to your wrist or forehead. The thermometer will make a beeping sound.







Follow the arrows on the floor round the gallery and join the queue to have your ticket checked. See if you can spot a witch on the walls while you are waiting.



The toilets are on the ground floor on the right hand side just before you go inside the theatre.

When you go inside the theatre, an usher will show you to where to sit.



When everyone is in the theatre in their seats and ready to watch *Little Gift*, the lights will go down a little bit. It will not go completely dark; you will still be able to see. It is the way of showing that the play is about to start.



In *Little Gift* we meet Guy. He tells the story, sings a song, and plays a ukulele. The play also has recorded music in it. It has been specially written to go with the story. If it ever feels too loud for you, you can cover your ears or put your ear defenders on.



The set is made of lots of suitcases. All the different scenes are made using the suitcases. Some open up and some move on wheels.



In the story Guy tells us all about Ted. Ted is a puppet who needs to make some friends to stop feeling lonely. Guy helps him.





It is fine to talk to the people you are sitting with about what is happening on stage but if you try and talk to Guy during the show, he won't be able to answer you because he will be too busy telling the story.



At the end of the play, the audience may clap to show they have enjoyed watching. You can join in if you want to.
