There's nothing quite like the experience of watching live events and the electric atmosphere that comes with being part of an audience. We're looking forward to seeing you again at The North Wall very soon.







Diana Forster:

Such A Long Journey

In 1940, at the beginning of the Second World War, Stalin's troops invaded eastern Poland. A million Polish people were forced from their homes at gunpoint and sent to labour camps in Siberia. Diana Forster's mother and grandparents were among them.

Diana avoids showing traumatic, disturbing images in her installations and prints as they can turn viewers away. If we accept a role for art in presenting subsequent generations with the realities of war, we have to find new ways of engaging audiences and Diana does this through formal qualities which draw the viewers' attention while the work is gradually understood.



The Society Of Wood Engravers:

83rd Annual Exhibition


The Society Of Wood Engravers (SWE) returns to The North Wall this autumn to present an entirely new selection of over one hundred relief prints.

The Society was founded in 1920 by a group of artists that included Philip Hagreen, Robert Gibbings, Lucien Pissaro, Gwen Raverat and Eric Gill. The group thrived until war broke out, disrupted the demand for their work and cut the supply of materials. In the years that followed, there was a return to the annual exhibition, but the group and the cultural context had changed.

Since the SWE was revived in the early 1980s, the Society has built up an international reputation for excellence. The annual exhibition, stringently selected from an open submission, tours nationally each year, showing the best of current work from Britain and other countries.

Jon Rowland: Heartlands

Jon Rowland works in mixed-media, using oils, acrylics and collage. This vocabulary has led to an exciting body of work for this exhibition, *Heartlands*. The themes for Jon's paintings have emerged from places that are important to him. Lockdown and the release from confinement have both had an impact.

Jon concentrates on colour and space, exposing the essence of 'place' and expressing the sentiments of this analysis. There's a story to each of Jon's paintings and, like any journey, there are unexpected outcomes.

In the last 15 years, Jon has held solo exhibitions at Said Business School, Sewell Centre Gallery, Wolfson College, Jam Factory, Cornerstone Arts Centre and The Barn Gallery. His works have appeared at Battersea Arts Fair and in Tatler magazine, and he has been commissioned, through Wychwood Art, for a number of large scale paintings.

ArtsLab: Fourteen

The North Wall's ArtsLab programme exists to create opportunities for early-career artists and this year, for the first time, is supporting visual artists. A group of talented local female photographers have been working together to develop ideas and new work, facilitated by North Wall Propeller 2021 Artist Philippa James. This exhibition uses the number 14 as its catalyst and is curated by the group to include one final work by each artist. More works by each artist can be seen in the online exhibition, live for the duration of Photo Oxford 2021.

Philippa James is a photographer living and working in Oxford. Her work explores women, under-represented populations, and her local communities. Her major body of work, 100 Women Of Oxford, was exhibited at The North Wall during Photo Oxford 2020.

St Edward's Oxford: **In Progress 4**

This exhibition celebrates the fantastic work from St Edward's pupils across all year groups. Although primarily a platform for the Lower Sixth to showcase work produced on the Teddies Foundation Course, the exhibition also presents work from Year 9, GCSE and Upper Sixth students.

The Teddies Foundation Course provides Lower Sixth A Level and IB pupils with an opportunity to explore a range of media over a sixteen-week programme. Pupils are encouraged to choose a theme at the beginning of the year which their work centres on and teachers introduce pupils to a new technique fortnightly. *In Progress 4* showcases the outcomes produced to date, approximately halfway through the course.

Three printmakers share their appreciation of the natural world, working in five different print processes.

Susan Wheeler's work is based on drawings done when out walking or in her garden. These drawings are translated into the more exacting language of the linocut that results in a decorative quality.

Manja Scott enjoys finding new ways of combining different printing methods; in dry point, carborundum, linocut, intaglio or monoprint. Whether the subject matter is figurative or abstract, Manja keeps spontaneity flowing from the beginning to the end of making the print.

Lizzie Wheeler's prints are about the way a place makes her feel. Her work combines monoprint, etching, and linoprint, to evoke these feelings through a lively interplay of colour, texture and line.

Manja Scott, Lizzie and Susan Wheeler are members of the Oxford Printmakers. Susan and Lizzie are members of the Oxford Art Society.






