Printmakers Co-operative staged one of the first ever exhibitions in the gallery back in 2008 – so we're delighted to be hosting them again this Christmas with *A Time To Gather*, showcasing a wide selection of work by their members.

Creation Theatre also first appeared at The North Wall in 2008 – with *Measure for Measure* – and we're excited to celebrate many years of friendship between our organisations with their production of *The Tale of the Beauty and the Tail of the Beast* this Christmas.

This season, we'll be returning to the park with *The Rascally Diner*, a show for families; as well as celebrating Oxford's Christmas Light Festival.

The Society of Wood Engravers (SWE) returns to The North Wall this autumn to present an entirely new selection of over one hundred relief prints.



Eric Ravilious: Drawn to War

Artist Eric Ravilious (1903 – 1942) was elected as a member of the Society of Wood Engravers in 1925. Known for his paintings and murals, as well as his engravings, his story is as compelling and enigmatic as his art. Caught in the crossfire of war 80 years ago, Ravilious's legacy largely sank without trace, until now.

Set against the dramatic wartime locations that inspire him, Margy Kinmonth's full-length feature documentary about Ravilious unfolds in his own words, through previously unseen private correspondence and rare archive film.

Shot entirely on location in the UK, Portugal and Ireland, the film features Ai Weiwei, Alan Bennett, Grayson Perry, Robert Macfarlane with Freddie Fox, Tamsin Greig and many more.

Parking: Two public car parks (OX2 7BY) are five minutes' walk from the North Wall (see map). There is limited on-street parking in South Parade.


Park and Ride: from Pear Tree (OX2 8JD) or Oxford Parkway (OX2 8HA).
